Cataracts	<p>Accredited optometrists should refer patients for cataract operations direct to the hospital, using the cataract referral form. Non-accredited optometrists <u>must</u> refer patients to an accredited optometrist. Patients already under the HES or with undiagnosed co-pathology should be referred in the normal way. 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Children	Vision screening in state schools at age 5 is conducted by the school nurse or health care assistant; some children are then referred to their local optometrist for further investigation. If presented with a form please return it as requested.		
Diabetics	All patients with diabetes should be offered retinopathy screening via their GP (organised by the PCT). If patients are not being screened, please refer to the GP with a request for retinopathy screening (not an ophthalmology referral).		
Dry eye (etc)	Dry eye, blepharitis, chalazion, stye & epiphora: only refer if six weeks of lid hygiene and artificial tears has failed to alleviate the symptoms.		
Glaucoma	Please be aware of the joint colleges (Dec 2010) guidance on referral criteria, available on our website (www.loc-net.org.uk/buckloc).		
IOP refinement	Practitioners who are accredited on the Glaucoma Referral Refinement (GRR) scheme can refine suspect ocular hypertensive (OHT) patient referrals using Goldmann Applanation Tonometry. Non-accredited optometrists should refer to accredited optometrists within their practice if possible, or to 'The Practice: Ophthalmology' if not. Patients with suspicious discs or visual fields defects should be referred in the normal way.		
Low vision	Optometrists can issue a low vision leaflet (LVL) to help patients access other low vision services, downloadable here: http://www.loc-net.org.uk/uploaded_files/11563223801731/low_vision_leaflet.pdf		
Suspect wet AMD	Rapid referrals for wet AMD can be made via special referral forms to four local eye departments (fax numbers can be found on the forms). Patients must have a visual acuity of 6/96 or better and less than a three month history of either: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. visual loss 2. spontaneously reported distortion 3. onset of missing patch / blurring of central vision. 		
Other referrals	All other referrals for an ophthalmologist's opinion should be sent to The Practice: Ophthalmology (see 'Triage' above). Please give a provisional diagnosis and suggest the appropriate clinic for onward referral (eg One-Stop YAG, oculo-plastic etc). Patients from outside the area should be referred to their GP.
