CATARACT ENHANCED SERVICES BOOSTED BY NEW TRAINING MODULES FROM LOCSU

Optometrists wishing to participate in new or existing local enhanced services for cataract referral refinement and post-operative follow up will be able to easily refresh their clinical knowledge thanks to a new training module developed by Local Optical Committees Support Unit (LOCSU) and Wales Optometry Postgraduate Education Centre (WOPEC).

The distance learning programme comprises 4 lectures and a video, available on CD Rom, and has been accredited with 10 CET points. The module addresses all potential aspects of cataract pathways from identifying different types of cataract to possible complications from surgery and includes all the necessary information and paperwork about the LOCSU pathway.

Once candidates have completed each lecture they simply upload their MCQ answers to the WOPEC web page (www.wopec.co.uk) for verification. A visual recognition and identification of clinical signs (VRICS) assessment is also available.

Katrina Venerus, Director of Operations and Commissioning at LOCSU said,

"This training package developed to complement the LOCSU cataract pathways will provide welcome support for Local Optical Committees (LOCs) when it comes to both the negotiation of new enhanced services and the renegotiation of existing schemes. By continuing to invest in easily accessible products developed by renowned clinical authorities such as WOPEC, LOCSU is giving practitioners the opportunity to maintain the most up to date knowledge and skills, allowing LOCs to provide reassurances on clinical standards to commissioners."
